Forcht Bank Will “Stick a Forcht in Hunger” Again



Forcht Bank will “Stick a Forcht in Hunger” again this year, with a food drive beginning now through December 20th, 2017 to help local families in need this holiday season.

The general public is encouraged to drop off canned or non-perishable food items at any of Forcht Bank’s 26 locations throughout Kentucky now through December 20th, 2017.
